Heart of the Matter:

Life with Meaning

A conversation with CEO Dan Johnson

What do I want? I want to age in a way that lets me be fully present each day, being engaged and contributing something of value to those around me in a way that's meaningful. Learning, doing, living in a place where I am known and belong. A safe home where I can mix with kind people. And I'd like to do this on my own, taking care of myself for as long as possible. I want to enjoy my children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. I don't want to be ignored, treated as a child, tolerated or patronized.

I want to be a part of my family's important events. I want to tell my stories to people who listen and laugh with me. On a summer day, I long to enjoy the warm sun on my face, the smell of cut grass, the sounds of life around me. I want to catch fish or enjoy a concert. And when life grows more challenging, I want friends and family to remind me that I am loved; that I matter to them and that my life made a difference to them. I want to know God and His grace and to know His nearness when I suffer. And, I want to honor Him with my life. And when my life ends, I want to sense Gods pleasure and to know that I will be welcomed Home.

Connections: During the past 32 years, Catholic Eldercare has continually grown to provide a variety of housing options. That's so important to have choices that fit lifestyles and needs.

Dan Johnson: People want a home that suits their needs. For many years, the residents lived in their long-time homes. But, in time, it becomes too much space to maintain, after the kids are gone. It can become a burden and a less satisfying place to live. The situation may keep you in and the world out. Isolation is not good for the spirit. So, we offer families some choices. It may be independent living with supportive services nearby, or assisted-living with some care services to help the senior maintain as much independence as possible. Or, perhaps, skilled nursing care for older adults that require a higher level of care. Whatever the needs, our goal is to ensure the older adult stays connected with the things they find of value and meaning. That should not change; we should not let it slip away. The daily lifestyle can still be maintained as one's care needs change and grow. And as needs do change, the individual is part of a caring community that continues to help them without necessitating a move across town to a new place.

Connections: When people visit or check the Catholic Eldercare Facebook page, they see residents enjoying many meaningful activities, art classes, fishing trips, card games, bingo and musical performances. Why is Therapeutic Recreation, one of the donor-supported programs, so profoundly important in the programming mix?

Dan Johnson: Seniors tell us they long to be useful, they can sometimes feel sidelined. The place they once held in the community has drifted out of their reach in a way. But there are still opportunities to meet new people, try new things, share laughter and have something to look forward to. As long as we're able to be active and try new things, we should have opportunities for that. When you're involved in something interesting or new, you step away from the routine, and that's refreshing and renewing, it recharges the psyche. There is value in trying new things, like the art classes for example. Seniors often discover a new dimension to themselves, a new creative gift, and that's pleasing. Donors make that happen.

Connections: And similar thinking is brought to the adult day program, Catholic Eldercare by Day, right?

Dan Johnson: Catholic Eldercare By Day is for families who need help with an older loved one still at home. They cannot sustain the stimulation required to give their loved one a meaningful day. The unrelenting care giving can be exhausting for the family, and they need a respite, too. When their loved one comes to Adult Day, he or she enjoys fellowship with others, participates in interesting activities, they can get a meal and a shower, even rehabilitative therapy and medication setup, if needed. And when they go home, they're renewed with a whole new set of experiences to share with their family. And, they look forward to coming back tomorrow. After completion of our new expansion and remodeling project in 2016, Adult Day will be dramatically more usable for the clients and staff.

Connections: Residents love having the chapel attached to the main campus. Pastoral care is important in finding meaning, especially at this stage of life.

Dan Johnson: Older adults are often facing big questions in life, there are things left undone or unspoken. Pastoral care can be helpful without being intrusive, as we help them find meaning and peace. We have dedicated chaplains who listen, encourage, and pray with them. The St. Anthony of Padua Chapel is a godsend and is symbolic of who we are. It speaks

to the importance of our faith and the set of values we hold dear. Residents love the daily liturgy and music, and we bring in musical groups for residents and the community to enjoy. We're grateful to be able to serve all generations, because a full life includes all generations.





Contented Living After Challenging Times

The year was 1923. Minnesotan Frank Mars introduced a new treat he called the Milky Way candy bar. Nationally, unemployment was stable at 2.4 percent and a postage stamp cost two cents. Minneapolis would soon face its worst smallpox outbreak, with 500 lives eventually lost.

But in a bustling Polish household at Adams and Broadway in Northeast Minneapolis, it was a joyful time - a newborn named Audrey was welcomed into the world.

Now 91, RiverVillage resident Audrey Grill reflects back on those days of early childhood, her memory still clear. "My mother died when I was five. She had a bad heart," Audrey explains. "A lot of my relatives had bad hearts and died early, but I'm still here so maybe I don't have a heart," she exclaims, revealing a lively sense of humor.

The young family persevered, with Audrey and her three older siblings helping with chores. Audrey attended Holy Cross school and later the St. Anthony of Padua Girls School, which would later become Catholic Eldercare's first residence.

In time, Audrey married and raised seven children in Northeast. And, perhaps, with a nod to her own self-reliant childhood, "I taught them all to cook, clean and do laundry, too. They are all good kids."

After her husband, Bob, died 25 years ago, Audrey found comfort with her children and grandkids. For awhile, she lived with a son, Mike, who had received a lifesaving liver transplant. "We figured I could take care of him and he could take care of me," Audrey explains.



But, the care giving became too much of a struggle. A fall finally helped Audrey recognize she needed more supportive housing and care. "Neither of them could care for each other fully," explains daughter Mary Harms. "We wanted to respect Mom's wishes in the matter so we came to visit RiverVillage and it all happened very quickly."

Audrey moved in during the summer of 2012 and quickly adapted thanks to her persevering spirit. She enjoys playing bingo and cards with friends, and especially likes the historical reenactors and musicians who regularly visit and perform. "I'm happy here. I don't have to do dishes or clean. The food is great; I love the liver and onions," Audrey tells a visitor. "And you don't need to fight the snow and sleet to get to church, so I have no excuse for not going," she adds with a smile. "I can't imagine a better place to live."

When Audrey, who has low vision, struggled to see when she got up during the night, she adapted by adding a bicycle light to her walker to illuminate the path. "It's my headlight," she says proudly.

Audrey's comfort and happiness offer tremendous peace of mind to her children."We feel so much better having her at RiverVillage," Mary explains. "She's in a safe place, well cared for. The staff are patient and caring. Having Mom here has freed us to be her children rather than her caregivers, so now we just enjoy each other."

Mary fell in love with RiverVillage too. She became a volunteer and regularly calls bingo on Saturdays. "I just really enjoy this group of residents. It's nice to be able to provide something they love to do."

Spring Dedication Planned for Major Expansion



The expansion will include a three-story addition with a Transitional Care Unit for short stay rehabilitation and recovery.

A June dedication is planned for construction of the 40,000 square foot addition which

will include a 24-bed Transitional Care Unit (TCU) and rehabilitation therapies department, and a remodel of the Catholic Eldercare By Day wing. Construction will be completed during summer 2016.

Physical, occupational and speech therapies, will be available at the new TCU for both residents and outpatients at the Catholic Eldercare campus, 817 Main St. NE.

Enhanced Community Care

The new TCU - Northeast Minneapolis' first - will be a significant addition to a competitive market, to better serve patients in Northeast and downtown. The facility will be distinct and separate from the nursing home, offering private rooms and a focus on returning patients to their home and regular lifestyle.

A stay in a TCU following a hospitalization is typically measured in weeks, as patients receive the rehabilitation they need to heal and recover their strength. Transitional Care enables patients to return home more confident, better able to self-manage and regain their independence.

Catholic Eldercare leadership worked closely with the city to bring the expansion project to Northeast. "We appreciate our Minneapolis City Hall partners. They understand the importance of a TCU close to home for those who live in this part of the city," CEO Dan Johnson said.

The enhanced Catholic Eldercare By Day department will be better configured to accommodate growing demand for adult day services.

Catholic Eldercare By Day Expansion

The adult day department enhancements are a response to the growing need for week-day support for seniors still living independently, usually with family. The new unit, licensed for 39 clients, will be better configured to handle the various socialization and care activities clients enjoy. The adult day program is a popular care option for older adults who are isolated and struggling to live independently. Clients enjoy stimulating activities in a relaxing atmosphere where they are safe, engaged, well cared for, and able to receive therapy, medication management and other care as needed.

In addition, the adult day program is a great respite for stressed caregivers who need a break from the responsibilities of providing constant care for a loved one.

A Pastoral Setting

As part of the construction project, the spacious St. Anthony of Padua Church grounds will be beautifully landscaped to enhance the peaceful environment for prayer and reflection. The stone shrine of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, dedicated on September 8, 1947 as part of the church's centennial celebration, will remain a focal point of the grounds. "Generations of parishioners and area residents have come to the shrine to pray and reflect, and that continues. We treasure this landmark," said Johnson.

Additional Rehabilitative Care Options

Short stay rehabilitation care is available now at the Catholic Eldercare on Main nursing home. And a satellite clinic offering rehabilitation services for residents and outpatients is located at RiverVillage East (2919 Randolph Street, NE).






